Leicester Diocese

Strengthening partnerships and learning from our brothers and sisters in Tanzania.

In March 2025 8 Diocesan reps, including 2 Bishops, 1 Dean, 2 clergy and a Lay Canon, made the journey from Leicester to Kiteto, one of our Tanzanian link dioceses, to celebrate Bishop Isaya's retirement and the appointment of his replacement, Bishop Bethuel. We joined a big congregation, fellow link folk from Wyoming, many Tanzanian Bishops, current and retired, the Archbishop of Tanzania and the Tanzanian Prime Minister at the service on 9 March 2025.

Bishop Martyn also unveiled a plaque commemorating the opening of Kiteto Dispensary on 8 March, marking its move to a new phase of providing more than eye care to the district.

Thank God for installation of Bishop Bethuel Mlula. Give thanks for the strong show of support from Leicester and Wyoming and the many new connections and friendships made.

- Pray that Bishop Bethuel will flourish in his new role. Please pray that a solution will be found to his most pressing issue; that of trying to run a diocese the size of Northern Ireland and Wales combined without a vehicle to get around. Pray too that as he refreshes the direction of mission for his diocese that the link dioceses will continue to support that vision.
- Pray for the work of the Dispensary, particularly for the need to attract and retain staff. Pray that Sister Sara's vision for better eye and primary care will be met.
- Pray for the work of diocesan schools and Pastor Mapenduzi who heads it up.
- Pray for the success of our link visit to DMK and Kiteto in September 2025, that those going will be
 inspired and moved on in their faith journey and for the strengthening of our ties. Please pray that the
 funds needed for the trip will be raised.

Church Mission Society (CMS)

Pray for the women who participated in the training to apply what they have learned as they step into new opportunities such as running small businesses.

what they have learned as they step into new opportunities such as running small businesses. *Malaysia: teaching theology* – E and R are based in South Asia, where they help people get to know God and serve others better through Bible study, theology training, pastoral care and work with Asia-CMS. Please pray for mission partner E and those he is teaching this week in Malaysia. As E opens up the Scriptures, pray for students to discover new perspectives and find fresh revelation in well-trodden passages. Pray for safe travel for E and the students as they return home at the end of their time together. *Middle East: safety in travel and for peace* – Pray for safety for mission partners J and R, who share Jesus with Muslims and work in Bible translation, as they travel from a conflict area in the Middle East. Please also lift up other people in mission travelling from the region back to the UK. Pray for people across the Middle East who are living in conflict zones – pray for hope, healing, reconciliation and a just peace. *Thailand: visa and relationship-building* – Mission partners Elise and Jon Fletcher are based in Khlong Toei, a slum in Bangkok, where they share Jesus' love with as many people as possible and are working for a brighter future for children at local and national level. Pray for Jon to be granted a long-term visa and for both Elise and Jon as they build relationship and partner with a local Thai church.
